

Construction Begins on the Joseph P. Mack '55



The University of Rochester is set to begin construction on the highly anticipated Joseph P. Mack '55 Catholic Center, a new hub for Catholic life on campus. Approved by the Board of Trustees and championed by President Sarah Mangelsdorf, the center will offer a welcoming space for fellowship, spiritual growth, and community engagement. This milestone reflects more than seven years of dedicated planning and collaboration, supported by the generosity of over 450 donors. Their contributions demonstrate the vibrancy and continued expansion of the Catholic Newman Community at Rochester, promising a lasting impact on students and the broader campus community.

The center's location, on Wilson Boulevard between Faculty and Library Roads, places it in the heart of the River Campus, adjacent to significant campus landmarks like Wilson Commons, Goergen Athletic Center, Prince Athletic Complex, Rush Rhees Library, and multiple dorms. This central location underscores its mission to be highly visible on campus.

President Mangelsdorf and the Board, officially named the Catholic Center in honor of Joseph P. Mack, a 1955 graduate, the center celebrates his enduring contributions to the university and Catholic life. A retired chairman and CEO of Saatchi and Saatchi Advertising Mack served as a University of Rochester Trustee for over 15 years, including chairing the Sesquicentennial celebration in 2000. A daily Mass communicant and a longtime Newman Community supporter, Mack has guided the strategic vision for Catholic life as a member of the Newman Advisory Board, the Newman Building Committee and a GEC supporter. His dedication has been instrumental in strengthening Catholic life at Rochester and ensuring the center's creation as a testament to faith for future generations.

Fr. Brian Cool, remarked on the center's importance, saying, "This project has been a significant need and a longtime dream. Joe's faith, leadership and vision have brought this to life, and it will inspire generations of Newman and University students."

The impact of this endeavor resonates with current students.

Timothy Guida '25, Newman's Music Director and a member of
the Building Committee said, "The dedication of our Newman
community is truly inspiring," he shared. "This new Catholic Center

Construction for the Mack Catholic Center is scheduled to begin on February 18th and be completed by October 31st. We will be completing our fundraising efforts during this time. Once completed, the Joseph P. Mack '55 Catholic Center will offer much more than a gathering space. It will include a full time Catholic chapel, meeting rooms, a commercial kitchen, and expanded offices for pastoral care. The Catholic Center is designed to be a welcoming space for students and groups from all backgrounds, including athletic teams, Greek life, and individuals seeking a venue for recitals and lectures, enriching the student experience, and fostering spiritual and personal growth across the university community.

Reflecting on the project's larger mission, Fr.
Cool stated, "As we begin construction and the
finalize phase of our fundraising, we are already
anticipating the fall opening our new Catholic
home as —a place to pray, to grow, and to gather.
Forever."
