
















Cool Thoughts

Do you have a desire to become Catholic, receive Confirmation, or gain a deeper knowledge of Church teaching and the Christian life? Join us for the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA). Sessions will begin soon.

What is OCIA?

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is the process established by the universal Church for individuals to become fully integrated into the Catholic faith and receive the sacraments of initiation — Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist, if you haven't already. This initiation process not only welcomes new members into the Church but also invites the entire parish community to experience a renewal in faith.

OCIA emphasizes conversion as a "spiritual journey" that deepens one's relationship with Jesus and His Church. This journey unfolds through distinct stages over a period suitable for comprehensive catechesis, meaningful community experience, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful.

The OCIA process is a revival of the ancient catechumenate used during the first three centuries after the apostles. It was the early Church's method of Christianizing the pagan Roman Empire. The Second Vatican Council called for the restoration and use of this venerable and powerful method of initiation for the worldwide Church.

Who can benefit from OCIA?

- Persons who desire Baptism.
- Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who want to become Catholic.
- Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.
- Anyone interested in deepening their understanding of the Catholic faith.

The OCIA is a formation process, not a fixed-length program. Each individual's spiritual journey is unique, and the OCIA respects the time and effort needed to prepare a candidate to live fully the sacramental life of the Church.

Session Information

Weekly 60-minute sessions are held from October through April, accommodating participants' schedules (with breaks for holidays). These include catechetical teachings and reflections on Sacred Scripture, led by a team of Newman members dedicated to accompanying candidates on their faith journey.






